## Evaluation and Review 2019-2020

### Information:

There were 15 children eligible for Pupil Premium, 1 child with the services premium.  
The pupil premium budget received was £21,120.

(Except where the child had PP and SEND).  There were five children in Year Six with PP entitlement (two of which had SEN EHCPs) and due to COVID there was no external data. However Teacher assessment (both at the point of the lockdown and in partial return in Summer) indicated that that the results would have been likely to be in the range of :Reading: 80% at or above expected level, Mathematics 60% at or above expected levels Writing 60% at or above expected levels (40% of which at greater depth).  Children in other year groups made progress in line with their cohort except or from their individual starting points. Evidence in work shows impact of interventions.

Partnership work with parents is being strengthened.

**KS2 Attainment and Progress of Children May 2020 (at Expected or Higher Standard)**

**There were five children in Year 6 with entitlement to Pupil Premium in 2020 there is no nationally comparable data due to the COVID 19 Pandemic.** Teacher assessment indicated good progress from their starting points.

The achievement and progress of children with pupil premium across the school (based on Teacher assessment in March 2020) is in line with the achievement and progress of all children. Where there is identified SEN, the achievement and progress is good from their individual starting points. Assessment data is not available for the end of the academic year 2020.
