Maths

Areas to be covered:

English

Linked to their IPC topic, we will be using three books: *The Adventures of Odysseus*, *Wolf Brother* and *Varmints*. Using these books, children will a sequential adventure narrative, a play script, a diary entry, writing from the perspective of a character and a narrative selecting the setting and what the characters would say.

This term's IPC unit is an exciting one!

The history of western civilisation begins with the Greeks and the Romans. Their expanding empires helped to spread ideas about architecture, food, entertainment, literature, science, medicine and politics across the globe. As their empires ended, other cultures rose to prominence, absorbing and passing on their own ideas and cultures - creating the world we know today.

We will need to be historians, geographers, musicians and artists to investigate and develop our understanding of different historical civilisations and their impact on our world.

How do their legacies impact upon the world we live in today?
This unit will also include Art and Design & Technology lessons too.

French

In this unit, learners start to create vector drawings. They learn how to use different drawing tools to help them create images.
