Welcome to the final newsletter of this academic year and what another fantastic year it has been. The school year has been full of hands on learning and an array of school trips where our children are always fantastic role models.

I am particularly proud of all of our achievements in Statutory Assessments this year. 84% of our Year 1 children scored 32 or more in their phonics test. 92% of our Year 6 children met expected standards in reading, writing and maths this year. This is 32 % above national standards! Our attendance is also above national standards and we end the year on 95.4%.

Uniform Expectations

As we prepare for the upcoming school year, we wanted to take a moment to reiterate our new uniform expectations for September. We are confident that you are already aware of these updates, but would like to ensure everyone is fully informed. The branded jumpers and cardigans, which are part of our updated uniform, can now be conveniently purchased from Graduates on Orpington High Street. Additionally, we ask that you review the new uniform list carefully, as there are a few changes that need to be noted. School uniform plays a crucial role in fostering a sense of pride and unity among our children, and we are very proud of how smart they look. We strongly encourage all parents and children to adhere to these new standards from September onwards. Thank you for your

Break-time Snacks

We would like to remind you of our school's healthy snack policy for break-time. To promote a healthy lifestyle, we ask that children bring in only nutritious snacks, such as fruit, vegetables, or other suitable healthy options. Please note that junk food, including crisps and chocolate, is not allowed. As part of the 'Healthy Start' initiative, infants are provided with a piece of fruit or vegetable daily. Often, there are leftovers that can be shared with the juniors, but this is not always guaranteed. Therefore, we encourage all children to bring a healthy snack in case what is provided is not to their taste or is unavailable. Despite previous reminders, there have continued to be instances where children have brought unsuitable snacks or taken treats from their packed lunches for morning break. We strongly discourage this practice and kindly request that chocolate bars and sweets are not included in packed lunches. Thank you for your cooperation in ensuring our children maintain healthy eating habits.



Please could we request your cooperation in parking considerately outside the school during drop-off and pick-up times. We have received several complaints about parents taking up more than one space, partially blocking the road, and obstructing the school gates. Safe and considerate parking is crucial to ensure the well-being of all our children, staff, and fellow parents. Please be mindful of the parking spaces, avoid blocking the road, and ensure the school gates remain accessible at all times. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Attendance Policy



We would like to inform you that our new attendance policy will be available to view very soon. We also want to update you on some changes to the government-issued rules surrounding term-time absences from school.

From August 2024, there will be a stricter approach in England to ensure every council follows the same guidelines. Schools must consider a fine when a child misses ten or more sessions (five days) due to unauthorised absences, including term-time holidays without the school's permission. Parents can be fined £80 if paid within 21 days, which doubles to £160 if paid late. The government hopes this will boost school attendance rates, which have dropped somewhat following the pandemic. Both parents could be responsible for paying a fine for a single child's absence, and in extreme cases, this could lead to larger fines or even a short jail sentence.

Additionally, there will be a strong focus on punctuality. It is important for children to arrive at school on time because every moment a child is late equals missed learning. Children who arrive on time start the day settled, relaxed, and ready to learn, while those who arrive late are often stressed and embarrassed and take a while to settle into their day. Late arrivals also cause disruption within the class, affecting everyone. Children arriving after 8:50 am will receive a late mark in the register, and those arriving after 9:30 am will receive a U mark, which counts as an unauthorised absence for the morning. Our Educational Welfare Officer regularly checks our registers and may contact parents should there be a high number of late marks. We also request that dentist appointments be scheduled during school holidays whenever possible.

As a school, we are unable to authorise any term-time absences. Additionally, any illness lasting five consecutive days or more will require medical evidence to be considered authorised. Any period of illness in the days directly prior to a school holiday will also be unauthorised unless medical evidence is provided.

From September, please notify the school office of any absence due to sickness or otherwise via email or phone call before 9:30 am. To request a period of absence for your child you must fill in an absence form available from the school office and return prior to taking your child out of school. Messages to teachers on Dojo will no longer be an acceptable way to inform the school of a planned period of absence or illness.

Our attendance at Downe Primary is good, and we are grateful for the cooperation from our parents. Thank you for your understanding and support in ensuring our children maintain regular attendance and punctuality.
